Depository and Central Registry Law promulgated by Law 93\2000,

Presidential Decree no. 51\1997 on provisions regulating CASE administration and financial affairs,

Executive Regulations of Capital Market Law promulgated by decree of the Minister of Economy and Foreign Trade no. 135\1993,

Executive Regulations of Depository and Central Registry Law promulgated by the decree of the Minister of Foreign Trade no. 609 \2001,

Decree of the Minister of Foreign Trade no. 383\2004 amending some provisions of the Executive Regulations of the Capital Market Law promulgated by Law no. 95\1992,

CMA Chairman decision no. 42\2006 issued on 17 April 2006 on CASE membership Rules,

And CMA Chairman decision no. 42\2006 issued on 17 April 2006 on requirements of establishing and licensing of securities companies.

# Decided: Article (1)

Paragraphs (4) and (5) of article (19) of CASE Membership Rules shall be replaced with the following:

- 4- Taking necessary procedures to ensure:
  - o Keeping, at all times, cash liquidity necessary to pay clients' dues.
  - o Commitment to pay clients' dues immediately after requesting them.
  - o Not using clients' money in any purposes other than that of the client.
  - o Book segregation, in a secured automated method that is clear to the client, among clients' cash accounts.
- 5- Taking necessary procedures for complete segregation among physical accounts of the clients. Supporting documents shall be kept to ensure the validity of the application of the procedures as well as making them available to the CMA and CASE when required.

### Article (2)

Paragraph (8) of article (3) of the abovementioned CMA Chairman's decision no. 49\2006. shall be cancelled

### Article (3)

The decision shall be published at Al official gazette and shall be valid as of the next day of its publication. The decision shall be announced on the dealing monitors and all other means at CASE.
